





Assumption of Risk and Liability - COVID



- Attendee assumes all risks and accepts sole responsibility for any injury (including, but not limited to, personal injury, disability, and death), illness, damage, loss, claim, liability or expense, of any kind, that they may experience or incur in connection with attending the ISHN annual meeting.
- We cannot guarantee that attendees will not be exposed to or contract a Communicable Disease at the ISHN
 annual meeting. Further, participants understand that attending the ISHN annual meeting could increase their risk
 of contracting a Communicable Disease
- Attendee agrees to abide by all applicable COVID-19-related requirements, advisories, policies, procedures, and
 protocols of the conference venue and as well as any other French governmental authority for the duration of their
 stay.
- Attendee understands the risk that they may be exposed to or infected by a Communicable Disease by attending
 the ISHN annual meeting and that such exposure or infection may result in quarantine requirements, serious illness,
 permanent disability and/or death. Attendee knowingly and freely assumes all such risks, both known & unknown
 and assumes full responsibility for their participation in the ISHN annual meeting.

War in Ukraine



- The University of Rennes, the INSERM, the CNRS and the Société des Neurosciences are all following the guidelines of France Universités, that are to cut all ties with Russian scientific institutions till the war ends. https://www.cnrs.fr/en/cnrs-suspends-all-new-forms-scientific-collaboration-Russia
- Since our event is on French soil, supported by French institutions, and organized by members of French institutions, we must comply with these guidelines, and are therefore **unable to welcome attendees and abstracts from Russian institutions.** This embargo concerns researchers established in Russia and working in Russian institutions, not Russian researchers working in or established in other countries, including France. Notably, Russian researchers working in French laboratories continue their activities, and students from Russia are allowed to come to France to study at French Universities, though exchange programs are suspended. This measure is therefore not an "anti-Russian" discrimination by nature, but part of the sanctions imposed by France and the European Union on the Russian government, following the invasion of Ukraine.
- Registration fees will be waived for Ukrainian academics and students interested in the history of the neurosciences, to help them attend the ISHN meeting in Rennes. Should the income from our annual meeting exceed our expenses, the surplus will be donated to a humanitarian charity to help the innocent people displaced by Russia's war rebuild their lives and their schools.
