## **Education & training**

<u>Council of the EU, Education, youth, culture and sport Council focused on education and</u> youth • 27th November • European Education Area

The Council of the EU approved a resolution on the second cycle of the strategic framework for European cooperation in education and training towards the European Education Area (2026-2030). The resolution sets out the work programme for the next five years. Here are the strategic priorities:

- Improving quality in literacy, mathematics and science for all, including efforts to improve access to high-quality early childhood education and care, particularly for learners from vulnerable groups
- Developing digital skills, including AI literacy, data literacy, and the responsible technology use.
- Creating inclusive and participatory learning environment at all levels of education and training.
- Furthering the implementation of initiatives such as the European Universities alliances and continuing the process agreed in May 2025 to implement a joint European degree label and paving the way for a joint European degree.
- Development of green and digital skills and of higher education in relation to AI and ethical and responsible use thereof.

#### **Equality, diversity, inclusivity**

<u>European Parliament (EP) SANT Committee • 5<sup>th</sup> November • Presentation of the analysis of the results of the EP public consultation on women's health</u>

EP SANT Committee launched in March 2025 a public consultation on women's health. The analysis of results was presented, and here are the noticeable points:



- The biggest challenge women face is the lack of recognition of women's health needs (62% of responses);
- Insufficient awareness of women's health needs is the main barrier (64%) withholding or blocking progress in addressing women's health issues;
- The highest positive outcomes for healthcare for women-specific diseases are in breast cancer care, both in the treatment and the respect shown by professionals.

### **Artificial Intelligence**

WHO Europe • 19th November • Release of the report "Artificial intelligence is reshaping health systems: state of readiness across the WHO European Region"

WHO Europe has just released a comprehensive overview of how AI in health is being adopted and regulated across the European continent, based on a survey open between June 2024 and March 2025.

Here are the key points of interest for the UEMS:

- Only 6 Member States (MS) offer in-service training opportunities to doctors, and 7 MS integrate it into medical education, mainly in northern Europe;
- Nearly half of MS have introduced cross-country regulatory knowledge exchange, in Northern Europe 70% of MS have set such collaboration;
- The motivations from MS to drive the development, testing or use of AI in health are mostly improving patient care and health outcomes (70% of MS), and reducing pressure on the health care workforce (67% of MS);
- The most common AI application is AI-assisted diagnostics used in 75% of MS, and in 100% of Northern European MS;
- Conversational platforms (chatbots) for patient assistance are the 2<sup>nd</sup> application currently used by almost 2/3 of the MS (90% in Northern Europe);
- Around 40% of MS use AI to automate logistics and administrative tasks.

#### **Cancer prevention & treatment**

<u>EP SANT Committee • 5th November • Exchange of views on Gastric Cancer Prevention and Screening in the EU</u>

The EP SANT Committee hosted a short discussion with Mr. Jussi Hahtela, CEO of Biohit Oyj about gastric cancer prevention, and mostly on screening. Mr Hahtela presented the GastroPanel® quick test, a non-invasive blood test which can simultaneously diagnose helicobacter pylori infection and chronic atrophic gastritis.

#### The key points are:

- Gastric cancer is the 6th most diagnosed cancer in the EU, and one of the deadliest of the most common cancers: five-year survival rate is below 30%, compared to around 90% for prostate and breast cancer.
- No MS has yet implemented any gastric cancer screening projects.
- A pilot screening programme conducted in Chile used the test to prioritise patients that should be sent to upper gastro-endoscopy. They were able to shorten waiting time and queue for gastro-endoscopy by 87%.

<u>EP SANT Committee • 5th November • Presentation of the European Parliamentary Research</u> <u>Service (EPRS) study "Europe's Beating Cancer Plan: Implementation findings"</u>

Among the findings of this study, I have mostly noted that for cancer health professionals, the EU is mapping workforce needs and skills gaps.

Through 2 funded projects, the EU-wide inter-specialty curriculum is being implemented in different cancer centres. Aside, training guidelines in digital technologies and healthcare innovation are being developed to address gaps in skills.

#### Cardiovascular diseases

<u>EP SANT Committee • 5th November • Exchange of views between the MEPs in view of the own-initiative report on an EU Cardiovascular Diseases Strategy</u>

MEP Romana Jerković, rapporteur of the future own-initiative report on an EU Cardiovascular diseases strategy, presented the main priorities to be included in the first draft:



- Prevention through education on nutrition and mental health and physical activity, and systematic screening for hypertension, diabetes and cholesterol for adults aged 35 to 70;
- Adoption or update by each MS of a national cardiovascular plan;
- Integrating women's health in the strategy, as cardiovascular diseases are the leading cause of death among women;
- Comparable and transparent data to guide decisions, with the support of the European Health Data Space for harmonised registries and similar quality indicators among MS
- Ensuring equity and regional balance in access to cardiovascular care
- Acknowledging the connection between the heart disease and other conditions
